- A husband cannot divorce his wife without giving her a "written notice of divorce" ("divorce certificate"). Matthew 5:31, Deuteronomy 24:1 (Protects wives)
- 2. If a husband is sexually immoral, and gives his wife a divorce certificate, she may remarry. Matthew 5:32a (Protects wives)
- 3. If a husband gives his wife a divorce certificate, but he has not been sexually immoral, he causes her to commit adultery. Matthew 5:32a In other words, a sexually immoral husband may legally release his wife from marriage, and she is free to remarry. Jesus' teaching here is unidirectional, because if the immorality was referring to the wife, she would already be considered an adulteress. (Protects wives)
- 4. A man who marries a woman who has been divorced because of her sexual immorality, commits adultery by marrying her. Matthew 5:32b In other words, a sexually immoral wife who has been divorced because of her immorality, cannot morally remarry. (Protects marriage)
- 5. If a husband divorces his sexually moral wife, and marries another woman, he commits adultery. Matthew 19:9 (Protects marriage)
- 6. If a spouse is sexually immoral, they can be given a certificate of divorce, but they cannot morally remarry. Mark 10:11-12 (Protects marriage)
- If a spouse divorces their sexually moral spouse, they cannot morally remarry. Mark 10:11-12; Matthew 19:9; 1 Corinthians 7:10-11 (Protects marriage)
